The NOR5KE Viking subsea cable links Bergen and Trondheim with 192 fiber cores, interconnecting with international cables to the UK, Denmark, and the US . Additionally, Norway's fiber infrastructure supports remote regions like Svalbard, where subsea fiber optic cables provide high-speed connectivity for residents, businesses, and satellite operations . Fiber optic cables are also used extensively for domestic terrestrial networks, connecting major cities and data centers, and providing low-latency routes to international points of presence in Frankfurt, Amsterdam, and London . These networks are designed with redundancy and high capacity, ensuring reliable service even in the event of disruptions.
