Role of Core Switch in Traffic Management

A core switch sits at the top of the network hierarchy, interconnecting distribution switches and aggregating traffic from multiple access layers. Its primary function is high-speed forwarding of data without performing complex policy checks, ensuring minimal latency and maximum throughput across the enterprise network. Core switches are engineered to handle 10G to 400G+ port speeds, making them capable of managing large-scale traffic from data centers, campus networks, or high-bandwidth applications like VoIP, video conferencing, and AI workloads.

Traffic Load Handling

Core switches manage traffic using several mechanisms:

- **High-Capacity Buffers:** Core switches have large distributed caches, often exceeding 1GB, compared to standard edge switches with only a few megabytes. This allows them to absorb burst traffic and prevent packet loss during sudden spikes. Each port can handle burst traffic for up to 200ms at full line speed, ensuring smooth forwarding even under heavy load.
- **Wire-Speed Forwarding:** Using ASIC-based hardware, core switches forward packets at line rate, minimizing delays and avoiding congestion caused by software-based p...
