- High-density installations: When multiple low-voltage cables are routed together, trays prevent tangling, maintain bend radius requirements, and allow for future expansion .
- Protection from physical damage: In areas where cables may be exposed to movement, abrasion, or accidental contact, trays and brackets provide a physical barrier .

Alternatives and Considerations

For smaller or indoor control boxes, conduits, cable clips, Velcro straps, or wire looms may suffice instead of full trays . The choice depends on:

- Cable type and diameter
- Total weight and quantity of cables
- Required bend radius, especially for fiber optics
- Environmental exposure and mechanical stress
