A distribution box may have a single incoming line or multiple incoming lines, such as a normal supply and a backup supply, often connected through a main switch or dual power switch for automatic transfer in case of failure . Each circuit is typically protected by a breaker, fuse, or RCD/RCBO, and the number of circuits determines how many separate loads can be served .
