

Drilling is possible in the distribution box

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Yeah as long as the cable is secured and the connector has a locknut, drilling a hole and deburring it to the best of your ability is fine.

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First prepare an awl and a lighter, then heat the awl until red hot, and then directly drill holes in the electrical junction box.

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In that case, drilling and tapping into the enclosure can be a serious issue since then you'd be compromising not only the ingress, but the explosion-proof nature of the enclosure.

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There's no interference or electrocution risk since it's an optical cable, however I'm very reluctant to do any drilling in the stud bay above / below my distribution panel, because I know it's ...
