

Place both low-voltage and high-voltage cables in one cable tray

Article Overview

High-voltage and low-voltage cables should generally not share the same cable tray unless separated by a continuous nonconductive barrier or other approved methods to prevent safety hazards and electromagnetic interference.

Safety and Regulatory Considerations

Placing high-voltage power cables and low-voltage communication or control cables in the same tray without separation is not recommended due to two main concerns: electrical safety and electromagnetic interference (EMI) . High-voltage cables carry sufficient current to pose a fire or shock hazard if insulation fails, potentially inducing dangerous currents onto low-voltage circuits . Regulatory standards such as the National Electrical Code (NEC) and TIA/EIA guidelines require physical separation or barriers to mitigate these risks .

Electromagnetic Interference (EMI)

High-voltage AC cables generate fluctuating magnetic fields that can induce unwanted currents in nearby low-voltage cables, leading to signal degradation, packet loss, or audio/video interference . The risk increases with parallel runs and long shared pathways, making separation critical in industrial and commercial installations .
