Environmental and Physical Requirements

Managed industrial switches are designed to operate in extreme conditions commonly found in factories, power plants, transportation systems, and other industrial settings. Key environmental requirements include:

- **Temperature Range:** Typically from -40°C to $+75^{\circ}\text{C}$, with some models rated up to $+85^{\circ}\text{C}$ for high-heat applications .
- **Vibration and Shock Resistance:** Switches must withstand mechanical stress from machinery and transportation systems .
- **Ingress Protection:** Rugged enclosures with IP40 or higher to protect against dust and moisture .
- **Electromagnetic Compatibility (EMC):** Shielding and filtering to operate reliably in environments with high electromagnetic interference .
- **Power Redundancy:** Dual or redundant power inputs (DC or AC) to maintain uptime in case of power failure .
