

Should cables entering the distribution box be blocked

The cable entering a distribution box should not be blocked; it must be properly secured and sealed to ensure safety and prevent fire hazards.

Proper Cable Entry Practices

Cables entering a distribution box should be fixed with locking nuts or cable glands to prevent movement and maintain a secure connection, rather than being blocked or obstructed . The edges of the entry holes should be smooth to avoid damaging the cable insulation, and the box should remain accessible for maintenance . Blocking the cable can create stress points, reduce heat dissipation, and increase the risk of short circuits or fire .

Safety and Compliance

- **Fire Prevention:** Distribution boxes must be installed in dry, ventilated areas without obstruction. Blocking cable entries can trap heat and increase fire risk .
- **Insulation and Grounding:** Proper cable entry ensures that insulation resistance tests can be performed and that grounding connections remain reliable .
- **Explosion or Hazardous Areas:** In industrial or hazardous environments, cable entries often require double sealing with flameproof putty or compression glands to prevent sparks or fire propagation .
