Electrical and Mechanical Requirements

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Wire Gauge and Material: Jumper wires should be made of solid or stranded copper with appropriate tinning if required. The gauge must match the current-carrying requirements of the circuit to prevent overheating and voltage drop. For electronic assemblies, 22-32 AWG is commonly recommended, but in distribution boxes, the gauge is selected based on ampacity and load requirements .

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Insulation: Insulation must withstand the operating voltage and environmental conditions, including heat, abrasion, and potential chemical exposure. Materials like Kynar, Milene, Kapton, or Teflon are suitable for high-temperature or industrial applications . Insulation should remain intact without nicks or damage to prevent shorts.

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Routing and Placement: Jumper wires should be routed to minimize bends and avoid interference with other components. In distribution boxes, wires should be fastened...
