

The gateway is connected to the core switch via a single network cable

Connecting a gateway to a core switch with a single network cable works but introduces potential risks related to redundancy and bandwidth limitations.

Implications of a Single-Cable Connection

A single network cable between a gateway and a core switch establishes basic connectivity, allowing the core switch to route traffic to and from the gateway. This setup is functional for small networks or low-traffic environments, as the core switch can act as the default gateway for VLANs and route traffic to the gateway device for external access . However, relying on a single cable introduces single points of failure. If the cable or the connected port fails, the gateway becomes unreachable, potentially disrupting internet access or inter-network communication . Additionally, a single link may limit bandwidth, which can become a bottleneck in high-traffic networks, especially if multiple VLANs or heavy data flows are routed through the gateway .

Best Practices

- Redundant Links: Use multiple cables with link aggregation (EtherChannel or Eth-Trunk) to increase bandwidth and provide failover in case one link fails .
- VLAN and Transit Network Configuration: Ensure a dedicated VLAN or transit network exists between the core switch and the gateway. This allows proper routing and avoids conflicts with other VLANs .
- Dynamic Routing or HSRP/VRRP: For larger networks, implement dynamic routing...
