- Outer housing: A durable, often IP65 or IP68-rated enclosure made from plastic or metal to protect fibers from dust, water, UV rays, and impact .
- Splice tray: Holds and protects fiber splices, usually created by fusing two fiber cables together .
- Adapter tray or connector panel: Provides connection points for fiber connectors and pigtails, enabling easy network expansion or maintenance .
- Fiber guides and storage: Plastic posts or cassettes inside the panel manage excess fiber length and prevent bending or damage
