They can handle high-density connections and support port speeds from 10G to 400G+, accommodating growing bandwidth demands . **Traffic Management and Reliability:** While core switches focus on speed, they also support Quality of Service (QoS) and large buffer capacities to manage burst traffic, prevent packet loss, and maintain smooth data flow in high-traffic envi...
