

What is the appropriate current rating for a relay protection device

The relay's current rating should be higher than this total to ensure safety. For example, if your system has a steady current of 5A and an inrush current of 10A, choose a relay rated for at least 12-15A. For example, a relay rated for 5 Amps at 125 VAC. Overload relays protect motors and equipment from thermal damage caused by prolonged overcurrent conditions. IEC 60255 defines standards, formulas, and performance requirements, enabling accurate calculations and real-world applications. Motor overload relays protect against sustained overcurrent conditions that cause dangerous overheating, insulation breakdown, and premature failure.
