

Which fiber optic cable is best for 48-core smart buildings

For smart building backbone networks, a single-mode 48-core fiber optic cable with loose tube construction, water-blocking gel, and optional armored or self-supporting design offers optimal performance and durability.

Key Considerations

1. Fiber Type:

- Single-mode (SMF) is preferred for smart building backbones due to its long-distance capability (up to 80+ km) and high bandwidth, making it ideal for connecting multiple floors, buildings, or campus-wide networks .
 - Multimode (MMF) is suitable for shorter intra-building links (typically under 2 km) but is less future-proof for high-bandwidth applications .
- #### 2. Cable Construction:
- Loose tube design protects fibers from mechanical stress and allows for water-blocking gel, which is essential for durability in both indoor and outdoor environments .
 - Armored cables (CST or steel tape) provide extra protection against physical damage, ideal for ducts, direct burial, or areas prone to mechanical stress .
 - Self-supporting figure-8 cables integrate a steel wire for aerial installation, reducing the need for additional support structures and simplifying overhead deployment .
- #### 3. Environmental Suitability:

- Indoor cables should be fire-rated (LSZH or plenum) to comply with building safety codes
